## Make a Plan for Election Day

Here you can:

1. **Confirm your state's voter registration deadline.** If you haven't registered yet, REGISTER!
2. **See a sample of your ballot** so you know what to expect. It's not just a presidential election. Make your vote count even more by knowing in advance who you're voting for in all local office races.
3. **Review any ballot referenda.** You'll likely be voting on important issues that your state legislature is sending to the people to decide. Many people don't see these referenda until they're at their polling place and aren't 100% sure what they're voting for. It's nice to read these referenda in advance so you can google any questions you may have before election day.
4. **Confirm where your polling place is** and when it's open. It might be different than last time. **Confirm the absentee ballot deadline** if you're planning on mailing in an absentee ballot.
5. **Look up identification requirements** for voting in your state.

Lastly, **make a plan for election day.** This may involve waking up early, scheduling a break from studying, or reminding your supervisor that you'll need to leave the hospital in time to get to the polls.
